Most restaurants will be happy to accommodate you. The dinners are available from Nosh Cafe (633-8417).

To meet the requirements of the laws of kashruth, the dinners must remain double-sealed during heating and serving. Some patrons who observe kosher dietary laws order a fresh fruit plate. Again, the request needs to be made well in advance.

golfer. At Binghamton he led the Bearcats to their second team title of the fall season and leads the team with a 71.60 scoring average.

In five of the six fall tournaments in which he participated he has finished in the top three with his team and has scored even better when he competed individually. His season

win-loss-tie record is a phenomenal 500-11-6, the only one in the division with a 500-win record. It is no wonder that his ambition in golf is to play in the Professional Golfers' Association of America (PGA) tour.
