Letter from Hallie Keren, President

Two years ago, Kadimah Academy embarked on a transformational journey that created an entirely new model for Jewish day school education in Buffalo.

In partnership with The Park School of Buffalo and the Buffalo Jewish Federation, we created the Kadimah Scholars, bringing together our top-notch Hebrew and Judaic Studies with Park's secular studies, extracurricular activities, and 34-acre campus.

We didn't know what to expect, in creating something completely unique in North America, but we haven't looked back since.


Despite routine challenges - and despite the worst global pandemic in more than 100 years - Kadimah has thrived with Park, and the light of our Jewish future is shining brightly. And we have all of you to thank for your support.

From the beginning, our partnership blossomed with the backing of both Federation and Park, who welcomed and embraced both our students and our two Kadimah teachers, who are fully part of the Park faculty.

Imagine a full classroom in the main library building on the center of Park's campus, filled with Hebrew all over the walls. We have that. Even part of the outside hallway, and the doors of the bathroom shared by other students and staff, have some Hebrew.

Imagine a room full of students of various ages, praying in the morning before school. Imagine Kadimah Scholars giving presentations about Jewish holidays to their non-Jewish classmates and the entire Park community - even distributing apples and honey before Rosh Hashanah, with explanations. Imagine non-Jewish students asking questions, and even wanting to join in. Imagine a sukkah on the lawn

outside the dining hall. Imagine our community Chanukah party, with more than 90 people, at Park's dining hall.



Park and Kadimah pivoted immediately to online learning for the rest of the year, keeping up our studies. And this year, we were among the few schools to maintain in-person classes, five days a week, all year, with very few cases of Covid and no on-campus spread.

Safety and social distancing precautions meant we were unable to gather as a Kadimah community, for praying or celebrations. But our creative and passionate teachers found ways to deal with those limitations, too, so our Scholars didn't miss a beat. We still prayed, we still celebrated, and we still learned.

Now, as the world emerges from this dark and dangerous period, Kadimah and Park are ready to soar again, with new optimism and hope, and a renewed sense of what we can accomplish together.

Today, we've nearly doubled our student count from our first month at Park to our expected enrollment for next fall. We've expanded our reach into both preschool and high school, with students ranging from four-year-olds to 11th graders for the first time in Kadimah's 62-year history.

Next year, we'll be back on track with normal classes and programs, with two dedicated classrooms on campus for Kadimah, and new ideas for growth. We've gained more students from across the Jewish spectrum. And we're ready to partner in new ways with the Federation, the Foundation for Jewish Philanthropies, the Center for Jewish Engagement and Learning, local synagogues and other agencies.

We are so grateful for the support and collaboration we have received from the Jewish community and from Park, and we are thankful for what we have been able to accomplish, especially given the unprecedented circumstances. But we have bold goals to do much more.

With your help and support, we will make Kadimah a central, meaningful and pivotal institution for Jewish Buffalo – one that not only provides an excellent education and ensures that any Jewish child can receive a Jewish education, but also that embraces everyone into our family and our *kehillah* (community).

We hope you will continue to join us in this incredible journey to make Jewish Buffalo the best it can be.

Michal Shmuel-Lewis, Hebrew Teacher, Lower, Middle & Upper School


Michal Shmuel-Lewis, a native of Israel, was the Hebrew Language teacher at Kadimah Academy from 2001-2019 and a school counselor since 2016. At Park, she teaches Hebrew to grades K through 10 and assists with the coordination of the Park-Kadimah Scholars program. Michal studied English and education at Seminar Hakibbutzim College in Tel Aviv, Israel, receiving a BA in 1997. She was certified through the Israeli Ministry of Education, and worked with various grade levels in Israel teaching English as a New Language. She also served as a Community Service coordinator at Kugel High School in Holon. After moving to Buffalo in 2001, she studied in the School Counseling program at the University at Buffalo, receiving her MA and a school counselor certification in 2006. She is in the process of being certified as a NYS English as a New Language teacher.

Besides teaching Hebrew language, Michal has run health, wellness, leadership and other character-education programs under her counselor role. She also has served as a senior adviser in BOCES leadership camps, and volunteered as a counselor in a family support center. In 2010, she received the national Grinspoon Award for Excellence in Jewish Education. She and her husband, Shai Lewis, live in Amherst and have two daughters.

Nirit Weiner, Judaic Studies Teacher, Lower, Middle & Upper School

Nirit Weiner was born in Israel and moved to Michigan in 1986. She attended the University of Detroit Mercy and graduated with a Bachelor Degree in world history with a minor in women's studies. She has been working in Jewish education for the past twenty years teaching nursery through eighth grade, and developed and implemented Hebrew programs as well as special needs programs. In addition, she taught at Kadimah Academy for two years prior to the transition to the Kadimah Scholars at Park in September 2019.




Most importantly, Kadimah has been and always will be a community, a FAMILY, and I thank each and every one of you for allowing me to be a part of this family for the last nine years.
